



1856 Landis Valley House Hotel

Landis Valley House Hotel was built in 1856 and is an original building from the valley's Victorian era. Still standing in its original location at the intersection of Reading Road and Kissel Hill Road, it served both local patrons and travelers. The hotel was used as the Landis Valley Post Office from 1872 to 1913, and up until the late 1960's still operated as a popular local bar and restaurant.

This is the perfect setting for a more intimate gathering such as anniversary parties, bridal showers, rehearsal dinners or luncheons. The hotel has a bar room, dining room and card room for a total of 832 sq. ft. and can accommodate up to 65 people. It is also equipped with a professional kitchen.

Heated and air conditioned, the Landis House Hotel is available year-round during daytime hours and after hours from 5:00pm to 11:00pm.
