

Herbs Plant Descriptions

BASIL, MARSEILLE Dwarf 10" plant; aromatic leaves; Nicely branched with big showy foliage; Space saver; good for growing in pots

BASIL, GENOVESE Classic Italian variety; 18"-24" tall; good for pesto; pinch back to slow blooming

BASIL, FLOWERING THAI Ornamental and outstanding culinary variety; 18"; Large, broad leaves and purple flowers; Excellent savory-sweet anise flavor

BASIL, SPICY GLOBE Compact globe shape, 8" tall; use in pots, planters

BORAGE, Annual; 18-36"; edible, azure blue flowers; Attracts bees and pollinator

CHIVES, Perennial; hollow round leaves; 12"-18" Edible pink flowers

GARLIC CHIVES, Perennial; flat, strap-like leaves; 24" tall; white star-shaped flowers

DILL, "Fernleaf" Annual; shorter variety; Sun; 18-24" Good for small gardens and containers

HOREHOUND, Perennial; 24"; thrives in dry soil. Horehound tea with honey soothes a cough

MARJORAM, Tender Perennial; use fresh or dried; Sweet fragrance; add to soups, stews

OREGANO, GREEK Perennial; low-growing; Culinary herb with intense flavor

PARSLEY, "Krausa" Dense triple-curved medium-green parsley; Rich, sweet flavor; Cold hardy annual

PARSLEY, ITALIAN Flat-leaved heirloom hails from northern Italy and grows to 12". Rich, sweet flavor; annual.

SAGE, Perennial; 12"-24"; purple flowers; Use fresh or dried; attracts useful bees

SAVORY, SUMMER Annual; Grows 12"-18", cut often; adds flavor to beans, soups

SAVORY, WINTER Perennial; Grows 12"-18"; over-winters; Stronger flavor than summer savory

STEVIA, Perennial; 12"-24"; leaves can be sun-dried, powdered and stored for future use

THYME, Perennial; 12"; brings depth of flavor to soups, gravies, casseroles, salad dressings. Especially attractive to pollinators
