Established thirty-five years ago at Landis Valley Village & Farm Museum, the Heirloom Seed Project focuses on seed preservation, growing heirloom varieties of vegetables that have historical significance in this Pennsylvania German region.

The Heirloom Seed Project is staffed primarily by volunteers who tend the gardens and preserve and package the heirloom seeds.

Heirloom or open-pollinated vegetables bring our history into the present with flavors and beauty from the past. Gardeners can save seeds from heirloom varieties with the assurance that the fruit from each new generation of plants will bear fruit that is true to the fruit from past seasons.
